

Bethel Hill Charter School's medication policy states:

Prescription Medications

Any child that will need to take a prescription medication during school hours must have a written note from the doctor stating detail instruction on dispensing the medication *at school*. Along with the doctor's note, the parent most sign a note that gives permission to the school to dispense the medication. Also, the medication **must** be in the original container.

Over the Counter Medications

Any child that will need to take over the counter medications during the school year must have a written note from the parents with detailed instruction on dispensing. Along with a note, the medication must be in the original container. Medications that are in a zip lock bag, or wrapped in plastic wrap, etc will not be dispensed. Also, the school can only dispense the medication if the child meets age, weight, and dosage requirements that are listed on the medication bottle.
